- 2.5 miles of wooded trail along the Passagassawakeag River
- Partnership with Coastal Mountains Land Trust
- Open to everyone

- Sidewalks
- Striped shoulders at grade

FUNDING SOURCES



- Armistice Bridge: \$2.7 million in City funds (borrowed), \$1,000,000 in grants.
- Belfast Harbor Walk: \$800,000 in City funds (borrowed, paid back from downtown TIF), \$803,750 in grants.
- Belfast Rail Trail: \$300,000 in City funds. \$400,000 in private fundraising through CMLT.
- Cross Street revitalization: \$550,000 in City funds (borrowed, paid back from downtown – waterfront TIF), \$500,000 CDBG.
